ANOTHER LITTLE REMINDER:

Safety when it is busy in the drop-off and collection area

Just another little reminder of a few points to note <u>when it is busy in the drop-off and collection area</u>:

- 1. At busy times, we would ask you not to park or set-down on the left as you enter the drop-off area. This blocks some of the busses getting through.
- 2. We would be most grateful if the drop-off area right outside the children's pedestrian gate could be used only by children who are helped to their classrooms by an adult. Please move away from this area as soon as you child has been met by an adult.
- 3. The safest place to drop children is the lane nearest the school, above the bus spaces. Children dropped here can get out of the car at the footpath side and walk safely to the gate.
- 4. Please drive slowly through the drop-off and set-down area and never stop to drop children in the middle lane. This lane is for moving cars only.
- 5. When you are using the lane nearest the road, please ensure that your child is accompanied safely to the gate or the footpath outside the school wall.
